

March is Brain Injury Awareness Month

Every March, the Brain Injury Association of America (BIAA) leads the nation in ob-

serving Brain Injury Awareness Month. We are proud that BIARI recommended the theme for the 2021-23 campaign, **More Than My Brain Injury**, to the national committee.

The More Than My Brain Injury campaign provides a platform for educating the public about the incidence and prevalence of brain injury as well as the needs of individuals who are injured and their families. It serves as a call to action for everyone, everywhere to join the Brain Injury Association in achieving these important goals:



- *Improve care/support for individuals with brain injury and their families
- *Increase understanding of brain injury as a chronic condition
- *Reduce the stigma associated with having a brain injury
- *Showcase the diversity of injury and the demographics of those injured

Many people living with disabilities have their lives defined for them. The **More**Than My Brain Injury campaign gives individuals a chance to overcome those definitions, allowing them to tell their own stories and change the narrative of their lives. The main message of the campaign is one of empowerment. Secondary messages include reducing stigma and showcasing diversity – in both cause of injury and the person injured.
